PROJECTS WITH SCHOOLS

We continued our projects with schools throughout November, providing school uniforms, bread, butter, jam, crumpets, bagels, cereal, milk and fruit to ensure that no child was hungry. As the children were placed in bubbles schools are unable to hold breakfast clubs and were going into school hungry, by providing breakfast goods the children are happy and sustained until lunch. We deliver to each school twice weekly to ensure they always have enough breakfast items for the children.











ONGOING SUPPORT TO OUR OLDER RESIDENTS WHO ARE STILL SHIELDING, FAMILIES IN DEPRIVATION/ FURLOUGHED/ JOB LOSSES.

We continued our projects to feed families living in deprivation, furloughed and those who had lost their jobs along with our older residents still shielding and children who would normally attend our Youth Club. In November we supported 2500 children each week with breakfast at school, 100 children with meals and snacks each week, 1600 families, 400 couples, and 540 older residents to ensure their mental and physical health and well-being which is our priority.











CHRISTMAS FUNDRAISING

At the beginning of November we began our very limited fundraising plan to ensure children would wake on Christmas morning to new Toys, Pyjama's, Clothes and Food. We were determined that children would visit a Grotto and meet Father Christmas and his Elves and a pandemic would not hinder this. We purchased a sleigh and trailer which was decorated by Volunteers to a very high standard and also a blow up Grotto with an entrance and exit door which was perfect for all Health and Safety legislation and social distancing etc.....

We emailed hundreds of companies to ask for donations of any kind and used our social media platforms to capacity to drum up support. We also began on line raffles as a fun way for adults to support us. We received 1000's of donations from the public and had numerous drop-off points around the City. The response was overwhelming and although it would be a much different Christmas to 2019 it would be the best possible under the circumstances.













SANTAS WORKSHOP

In mid -November our Main Hall was transformed into Santa's workshop and was filled to capacity with 1000's of toys, pairs of Pyjama's and clothes ready for Operation Christmas to begin. The Christmas Lights began to shine. Staff and Volunteers had a slight spring in their step as we had managed to pull off the impossible under the most horrendous of circumstances and we were elated with our achievements. The referrals for support began to come in thick and fast via email, phone, our website and social media platforms. We continued to work tirelessly to ensure every referral could be honored. From 1st December the madness began and Father Christmas and his Grotto visited 12 schools/ nurseries and every child received a present. Our sleigh also rode throughout the streets of Liverpool each evening in December and stopped in 8 shopping car parks, outside both Everton and Liverpool football stadiums and 4 Community Centre's across the City to ensure as many children as possible met Father Christmas. A total of 3600 children met Santa in his Grotto at schools and received a gift. Unfortunately it is impossible to put a total figure on how many actually saw our sleigh and visited the grotto at the locations mentioned above as the turn out to each location was magnificent and it was impossible to collate figures for these events. The number ran into 1000's and the feedback has been absolutely amazing. Over 8000 families and older people received support in December ensuring a magical Christmas for all.













FOOD UNION

Staff and volunteers worked extremely hard to launch our food union back in March 2020 and obviously with lock-down it was only open to the public for 3 weeks. We were delighted to re-open our doors in November. Our food union enables residents to shop for branded goods at a very low cost. The food union came about after months of consultations with residents. We knew many residents only come to us when they have not eaten for days as there is a stigma and shame about using a Foodbank, this is detrimental to their Mental and Physical health and well-being. Our Food Union is empowering residents to become self-sufficient. Ensuring they are stronger and more confident and keeping their dignity. It has increased the number of local residents reporting financial stability as a result of Liverpool 6 Community Association Food Union. Local residents report better quality of life, family relationships as a result of engaging with Liverpool 6 Community Association. Increased confidence within local families and Improved health and wellbeing. We have over 800 members and this figure is increasing weekly as word spreads and also the power of social media.























JANUARY/FEBRUARY/MARCH LOCKDOWN

The news we all dreaded but expected came in early January. Somehow the impact seems much worse this time on all. Passion and commitment has kept staff and volunteers here at the L6 Centre motivated to support all who need us although lockdown is taking its toll on all. More and more families who are furloughed or have lost their jobs are struggling financially and our food parcels are crucial to their emotional, physical and mental health and well-being. Our older people still shielding depend on food parcels especially if they have no family or friends for support and of course our children who have been absolute heroes throughout this whole ordeal and miss their friends and normality more than any of us. Since the beginning of January we deliver between 140–170 food parcels per day 5 days a week. We also continue to deliver activity packs and meals and snacks to all children who would normally attend our youth club, we have also given out 75 slow cookers to our children's families to do some online cooking classes with them all. We have delivered to 31 sheltered schemes ensuring every resident receives food. In total in January, February and first week in March 9400 food parcels have been issued throughout Liverpool. Our uniform and baby projects have also continued throughout lock down providing new uniforms, prams, cots, baby gates, nappies and milk to families across the City.

We know the future will be a very challenging time and we are all very eager to put March 2020. Mid 2021 behind us and focus on the future. We will continue
